The last will and testament of John Russell Senior of Woburn in the County of Middlesex in the Massachusetts colony in new England being thereof in body but perfect in memory: Inq: I bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Russell all my goods of what housing and lands at home and abroad during your life: one and two of before on William Green: My will is that my wife shall have liberty to sell any parcel of land for your necessity during your widowhood: My will also is that after my wifes decease all my housing and land at home about my house shall fall to my son John Russell: and all lands and meadows also of what shall fall to my son John Russell and the other halfe to my daughter Mary Brooke: also what monethly is left after my wifes decease shall fall equally to one halfe to my son John Russell and the other halfe to my daughter Mary Brooke: My will is also that if my wife do sell any parcel of land that my son John Russell shall have the first refusal of the sale of it: this 27th of the 3rd month 1676

That no request names are under written did I want of you if you had seen this will your answer was no would not because you saw did so state but your answer was that it did not your mind fully:

pleas'd god to take away my Honourd Grandfather & my father
Jⁿ: Russell formerly of Wobowen, ~~and my mother~~
& my Hon^d Grandmother Elizth Russell y^e eldest of my
Grandfather, was Granted administr^r to y^e Est^t of her Husband
and she exhibited (an inventory with) to y^e Hon^d County
Court of Midd^l: and administr^r upon y^e Est^t: and y^e
movable Est^t: not being sufficient to paye y^e debts and
to maintaine herselfe, she made a petition to y^e Hon^d Court
held at Boston in Octob^r 1681: for liberty to
sell lands which was granted, as I have here to show
under y^e Secretaries hand, and some lands she sold and
spent y^e money, and about three years in y^e latter part
of her dayes she grow'd distracted, and was not Capable
of selling for her need, much Charge she my selfe
subscrib'd her selfe and others to, in y^e Condition, she being
deceas'd I have taken an Inventory of y^e little y^e is left
to present to this Hon^d Court desiring administr^r
of same I bring y^e eldest of y^e family of ~~me~~
