Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of  
the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832

State of Kentucky }  
County of Garrard }

On this 20th day of August 1832 personally  
appeared in open Court before the Honorable  
John L. Bridges Judge of the County of Garrard  
name sitting Abraham Ruffel a Resident  
of County of Garrard & State of Kentucky aged  
about seventy two years who being put duly  
Sworn according to Law, both on his oath  
make the following Declaration in order  
to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress  
passed June 7th 1832 that he entered the service  
of the United States under the following  
officers and served as herein stated

about the first of April 1780 he joined Capt  
Walls militia Company as drafted militia  
man in Halifax County Virginia he march-  
ed up on for Norfolk as far as Petersburg  
& was discharged for one month's term of duty  
& about the first of January 1780 he entered the  
service of the United States as a <sup>time</sup> under the  
same Capt Wall as a substitute for John  
Storie a drafted militia man for three months  
in Halifax County Virginia, he marched us  
on through Petersburg to General Melinburgs  
Headquarters at Cabinpoint the Commander  
of the Regiment not recalled marched from  
Cabinpoint on by Smithfield & Cooper Mount  
to Norfolk & there we had a small  
engagement with the British, of ~~the~~ party  
who killed one of our men. We then ~~returned~~  
to Smithfield & was there stationed until

we were discharged for a term of three months  
by General Malinsburg

He entered the Service of the United States the  
third time about the 1st of July 1781 in Halifax  
County Virginia under Capt. Cooper as a drap  
ped militia, who marched us on to General  
Lawson's headquarters at Prince Edward Court  
house who march us to Carter's Ferry on James  
River & up the same to the Point of Fork to  
General Stebbins' Headquarters where we  
had some firing with the British across  
the River, who march us again across the  
County to Stanton River near Boakes Ferry & here  
we were stationed there, where on June 1st one  
day he got his arm put out of place at the  
Court which still remains so to this time  
From there we marched back to Carter's Ferry  
on James River & there was ordered to the  
Hospital where he remained until discharged  
which was for the full term of three months  
Sworn by the Commandant of the Hospital  
thinks his name was Cooper making all  
seven months service, he has no documentary  
evidence & that he knows of no person who's  
testimony he can procure who can testify to  
his service. He hereby relinquishes every claim  
what ever to a pension or annuity except  
the present and declares that his name is not  
on the pension roll of the agency of any State  
Sworn to and subscribed the day and year  
aforesaid - - -
